

Home and School Meeting

Date: November 30, 2016

Principal's report:

- Staffing:
 - New Secretary Helen Saraglou has been hired to replace Emily. Helen lives in the local area and is very excited to be a part of Withrow.
 - We are still waiting on Board Approval to hire a new Head Caretaker. The old Head Caretaker has been transferred to Dundas P.S. on account of her specific skills that were more suited to that school.
 - Ms. Cronyn is going on maternity leave shortly, and a replacement LTO teacher position is open. Might be a challenge to fill a mid year French Immersion spot. An advertisement has been placed, and interviews are underway.
- Facility
 - 10 new trees have been placed
 - Dead trees will be removed in the spring
 - School council met with visibility assessment team in order to investigate vendors for a new climber.
 - Climber costs must be paid for upfront and the funds are currently allocated within the budget.
 - Suggestion to have students vote for the style of climber once options have been narrowed down.
 - Plan is to have the climber installed by next fall 2017
 - Location of climber will be the “tree island”.
 - The new field will open in the spring. The grass is a challenge to maintain especially during the “Spring Stomp”. To maintain the health of the grass the field will be diagonally fenced off every spring to ensure health of the grass.
- Achievement

Learning Skills: Once the first report card is issued, teachers come together to take a closer look at what skills are missing. This year there will be a focus on Responsibility (Juniors) and Self Regulation (Primaries). These skills will be discussed through classroom initiatives, assemblies etc. A similar initiative in regards to learning skills was carried out 2 years ago with great outcomes.

EQAO:

- Most recent EQAO results were compared 2013 results on account of TDSB work to rule.
- There were concerns related to the Grade 3 Math score. A discussion was held regarding potential issues that might have affected the scores both that could and could not be controlled by the school:
 - A smaller sample of overall Grade 3 students, as French Immersion students do not take the entire test only the Math portion
 - Transient students in Grade 3 who might not be in the school for the entire year, and therefore not have the benefit of a year's worth of instruction
 - French Immersion students only take the Math portion of the test, and therefore do not have the additional testing experience that the English students have.
 - There was an overall decline in Math scores seen across the province
 - When teachers looked at the individual test question data – they were able to determine some areas that students faired poorly on such as – multistep questions, and questions where multiple pieces of learning needed to be combined to answer the question. As an outcome of this analysis, a greater emphasis will be placed on teaching students how to tackle these types of questions.
 - Withrow has been approved to work with Board certified Math Coaches who will help outline a specific Math strategy for the school.
 - There will be an overall Math Inquiry into the math skills of all grades, not just those affected by the EQAO.

Student Initiatives

- The last assembly focused on Empathy, and several students presented a variety of projects such as:
 - Coat Drives
 - Roots of Empathy Program
 - Visits with veterans at Sunnybrook
